Hunger Prevention Services in Talbot County for nearly 54 Years!

Additional Hunger Solutions:

40-50 Daily

Approximately 40-50 individuals per day and/or 200 - 250 per week participate in NSC's Daily Food Give-away.

4-5 Per Daily

Approximately 4-5

Emergency Food Packs are given to customers with immediate hunger needs daily.

1-2 Monthly

Beginning in February 2022, NSC has provided between 1-2 food drops per month at partner sites.

- In FY20, NSC received a CSBG-D Discretionary Grant to provide mobile food services to seniors, the disabled, and those living in remote areas of Talbot County!
- In FY21, NSC received a CSBG CARES grant which funded the purchase of two vehicles to provide mobile food drops to those affected by COVID-19!
- NSC received a Capacity Flash Grant in Spring 2021 for the purchase of new freezers, food cards, thermometers, and other items for our food pantry!
